What Is ALP?

The Alpha Leadership Project (ALP) is a program within DC-CAP, designed for young men of color in DC public and public charter high schools.

ALP strives to assist and empower students through the educational process, improve academic achievement, increase the possibility that they graduate from high school, and be socially and academically prepared to enroll and graduate from college.

The Academy

The Academy is the 9th grade component of the Alpha Leadership Project.

Through a series of monthly, discussion-based workshops and activities, students will learn about time management, leadership, academic and personal development, while being indoctrinated into the “Alpha Way.”

The Fraternity

The Alpha Leadership Fraternity (ALF) is designed for upperclassmen, grades 10-12.

The Fraternity students are expected to serve as role models to the younger students and will participate in academic advisement, leadership exercises, and culturally enriching activities.

Mentoring

Young men need strong role models in their lives to aid in their decision making process.

ALP students are matched with a mentor to provide guidance and act as a role model.

The mentors participate by e-mentoring using the ALP mentoring website. (www.dccap.org/mentor)

Mentors are also invited to the monthly workshops to support academic achievement, and encourage meaningful communication.

Parents can log-in to their son's mentor page using his username and password. (username first initial and last name, password: school name 2020)





Scholarships

Every 9th grade student who completes the ALP Student Workshops component (attends 8 workshops) and whose parent / guardian completes the ALP Parent Training (views all 6 workshops) will be guaranteed the DC-CAP Last Dollar Award for their freshman and sophomore years in college (**\$4,000**).

If the student completes the program, but the parent / guardian does not, the student will be guaranteed the DC-CAP Last Dollar Award for their freshman year only (**\$2,000**). Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA in high school to be eligible for the award.





Parents

Parental involvement is integral to the success of the Alpha Leadership Project and to the students involved in the program.

Parents are able to participate in online workshops to assist them in the continued development of their child.

Workshop topics include: Promoting Self Discipline, Supporting Academic Achievement, Communicating with Your Son, Crisis Management, and Teaching Responsible Manhood.
